

SETS Society for Electronic Transactions and Security: 25th Foundation Day Research Colloquium

Submission Instructions for Extended Abstracts

1. Overview

In celebration of its 25th anniversary, the Society for Electronic Transactions and Security (SETS) is organizing a Research Colloquium on Advanced Cyber Security Research. SETS invites research scholars and students to submit high-quality research contributions.

This event aims to motivate emerging researchers by providing a platform for peer-reviewed research, enabling interaction and engagement with leading experts in cybersecurity and related domains.

The event specifically encourages students and research scholars to submit research papers jointly with their supervisors.

It offers a valuable platform to showcase their work to the wider cybersecurity research community, fostering academic interaction, networking, and potential research collaborations.

2. Submission Guidelines

- **Limit:** Each author is allowed only one submission. The submission must be endorsed by the supervisor, along with an affiliation and bonafide certification from the respective institution.
- **Selection:** Papers will be selected for presentation based on a peer-review process conducted by the review committee.
- **Sponsorship:** Students and research scholars whose papers are accepted will be provided sponsorship for travel and accommodation to present their work at the colloquium.
- **Formatting Compliance:** Submissions must strictly follow the prescribed template. Papers that do not adhere to the template guidelines will not be considered for review.
- **Plagiarism Policy:** All submissions will be checked for plagiarism. Papers with significant plagiarism will be summarily rejected without further review.

3. Content Requirements

- Nature: The extended abstract must be more than a long abstract; it should include references, comparisons to related work, and key theories.
- Gaps: It must clearly specify theoretical and empirical gaps being addressed.
- Structure: Must include an introduction, methodology, results, expected contributions, and conclusion.
- Length: 3 to 5 pages including references.
- Word Count: 1,500 – 2,000 words.

4. Formatting Summary

- Font: Times New Roman.
- Margins: 1-inch (2.54 cm) for all sides.
- Alignment: Text should be left-justified.
- Page Numbers: Bottom right corner in 12-pt normal font.
- Spacing: Single spacing (0 before and 0 after).
- Paragraphs: Leave 1 line space between paragraphs and between headings and text.
